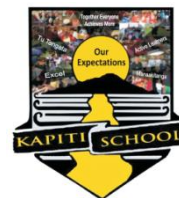

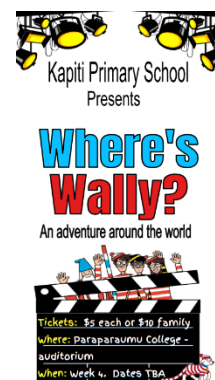
This term has so much going on:
