PB4L Learning

Here are some of the programmes that we have going on to help our children learn our school values:

- Circle Time: Kereru have sessions developing social skills and problem solving with RTLB teacher Carol Rankin Lloyd and Whaea Amanda. This programme will be used in all Year 1-4 classes next term.
- The Year 5-8 team is working with Constable Sue Bush and Police Youth Aide Officer Andy Alexander on the Do the Right Thing Programme. This programme developed understandings around honesty, right and wrong and community responsibility.
- PB4L classroom lesson time: All classes have regular weekly sessions to target specific behaviour needs relating to our TEAM values. From lunch eating expectations to being a good friend or positive role model, all aspects of positive behaviour are covered.
- TEAM tickets: Both in the classroom and out in the playground, our tamariki are noticed for the positive behaviour they show and TEAM tickets are given in recognition. Classes have their own sticker charts or Dojo points that keep track of the awesomeness and rewards are very much appreciated by the classes!

Powhiri for our new Principal

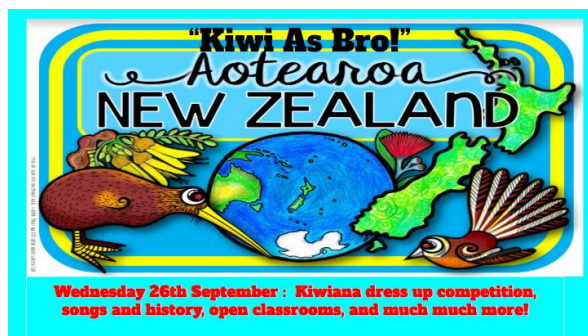
