**Kapiti Fruit and Vege Co-op:** We are pleased to be new hosts to the Kapiti Fruit and Vege Co-op which kicks off for the year with first pack on 7 Feb (first orders and payments in by this Friday). The co-op is a partnership between Regional Public Health, Wesley Community Action and local community organisations to see good quality fruit and veges made available to our neighbourhoods at reasonable cost each week. Kapiti Anglican Church is pleased coordinating this initiative in the Kapiti region. We are welcoming past and new members to sign up for the 2019 year. Packs cost \$15 per order/pack (about \$20 in value) with 3-4 varieties of seasonal fruit and 3-5 varieties of seasonal vege. Payment is made the week before delivery by internet banking or by cash payment to the coordinator. Collection is on a Thursday from your nominated collection point (three currently). We aim to expand the no. of collection points if we get sufficient orders from that community ( eg.
