## Amohia Street Stormwater Upgrade

#### Rimu Road traffic management changes 10 June

Below is the latest information about the stormwater upgrade.

Thank you for your patience and cooperation during the full road closure of Rimu Road while our contractors installed a new manhole as part of our Amohai stormwater upgrade. We appreciate this has caused disruption to school and kindergarten drop offs and pickups, we apologise for the inconvenience.

We're pleased to say that progress has gone well and that our contractors will be able to move to the next stage on Rimu Road from Saturday 10 June.

Following an assessment of how our Stage 1 traffic management plan worked during the road closure, we have adjusted our Stage 2 traffic management plan which will now see Rimu Road open to one-way traffic travelling from north to south. This differs to what we have previously publicised in an aim to lessen the impact on the wider roading network. We'll also be opening Iver Trask Place back to two-way traffic but will be keeping speed management controls in place.

Attached is the map of the Stage 2 traffic management plan which will commence on Saturday 10 June. This includes:

Rimu Road open to one-way traffic travelling north to south.

One right-turning lane onto Rimu Road from Kāpiti Road will be open.

A left turn into Coastlands' northern entrance will be open however, left and right turns out of this entrance are closed. Please use other exits.

Iver Trask Place returns to two-way traffic and continues to act as a detour for those travelling north on Rimu Road to Kāpiti Road.

Right hand turn from Iver Trask Place onto Rimu Road will be open.

Left hand turn from Iver Trask Place onto Rimu Road will be closed.


Temporary bus stops for 1100 and 1102 remain in place.

Please encourage any heavy vehicles to take alternative routes and to especially avoid Iver Trask Place.

The Amohia stormwater upgrade work along Rimu Road is expected to take up to four months with Stage 4 due to run between 20 August and 24 September where it will reach the Kāpiti Road intersection. Work will progress east along Kāpiti Road towards Amohia Street with approximately 805 metres of new larger stormwater pipe laid by March 2024. Each of these stages will have their own traffic management plan which we will continue to send to you before they are set in place.

Upgrading this critical infrastructure will help reduce flooding for approximately 350 properties in the area while helping our district prepare to live with more rain. We appreciate your support as we undertake this important mahi.
